Travel Policy - Team Ontario

The intent of this Policy is to ensure that players are aware that they represent Ontario team to competitions in the tournaments and/or participating in CCO cricket related events. CCO teams will receive extended liability insurance coverage. However, this extended liability coverage does not include health insurance coverage. Therefore, when teams are traveling to the U.S. and other countries, must have extended medical coverage and confirmation must be submitted to CCO office.

Rules of conduct Introduction:

- Conduct, at all times, shall reflect honesty, good sportsmanship, courtesy and respect toward others. All rules and regulations of CCO must be followed at all times.
- Athletes (and their parent/guardian if under legal age) and coaches are required to read and abide by the Rules of Conduct, if selected to an Ontario Team. All selected athletes and coaches shall receive a copy of Rules of Conduct for Ontario Team Representatives
- Coaches & Manager bear the primary responsibility for preparing athletes to conduct themselves properly at any event or competition Ontario team is participating
- In the Rules of Conduct, the term "delegate" refers to any athlete, coach, chaperone, or other official traveling as part of the Ontario delegation to a competition. "Legal age" means 18 years of age. If the legal age of the country or province where a competition is located is higher than 18 years of age, then such older legal ages shall apply.

General guidelines;

- All delegates are expected to abide by the decisions of Team Officials.
- All delegates are expected to comply at all times with the rules, regulations and protocol as laid out by the organizing committee of the competition.

Dress Code:

- All delegates are expected to comply with dress codes. This includes traveling attire and attire at the competition locations, warm-ups, and competition.

Individual Expenses

- All provincial team players shall be responsible for their own expenses except for the travel and accommodations as arranged by CCO

Curfew :

- All athletes are expected to comply with curfews before, during, and after competition.
- Curfews shall be set by the management team (Coaches & Manager) on the basis of age and not discipline or gender.

- Where athletes of different ages are rooming together, the curfew applicable to the youngest athlete shall apply to all athletes assigned to the room.
- Curfews must be obeyed, except where a competition or training is scheduled or continues beyond the appointed curfew time.
- The Head of the Delegation may set a reasonable curfew to be followed by any other delegation members staying at the same facility as athletes.

Travel/Accommodation:

- All delegates are expected to comply with team travel arrangements and schedules.
- Any delegates requiring special arrangements due to extenuating circumstances must make such arrangements through the Team Manager prior to travel.
- All athletes are expected to remain with the team during travel, and at the competition location, unless specific permission is received from Team Officials.
- Arrangements should be agreed upon between athlete, coach, and Team Manager at the beginning of the trip, for those old enough and mature enough to be responsible for themselves. Such athletes must ensure that their coach and/or Team Manager know of their whereabouts at all times.
- Accommodation changes, if different than those formally arranged by CCO must be approved by the Head of the Delegation or Team Manager.

Alcohol/Banned Substances:

- All delegates are subject to restrictions as to the use of alcohol or any banned substances as prescribed by Law, any other sport governing body or Sport Canada, or any conditions or restrictions imposed by any local authority.
- Use of banned substances for improving performance is prohibited as specified within Sport Canada's anti- doping policies and testing procedures.

AP P L I C A T I O N O F R U L E S O F C O N D U C T

- The Rules of Conduct shall apply to any competition to which Ontario athletes travel with a coach or manager appointed by Cricket Council of Ontario
- When Ontario athletes travel as part of another team, such as a National Team, they shall also be subject to the rules of conduct of that team.

Disciplinary actions

- Delegates violating the Rules of Conduct for Ontario Team Representatives may be subject to disciplinary actions(s) in addition to any sanctions or penalties applied by law or other agents.

- The Head of Delegation, in consultation with team coaches and managers, is empowered by the Board of Directors to impose the following sanctions on any delegate who fails to comply with the Rules of Conduct when participating in or traveling to or from any activity organized and/or sanctioned by CCO and/or when representing CCO in any capacity:
 - Verbal or written reprimand;
 - Restriction or limitation of onsite activities, including the removal of certain privileges;
 - Removal of the athlete, coach or Manager from competition;
 - Delegate sent home at own expense;
- The Team Manager shall properly document the incident.
- The athlete's club and coach will be notified in writing of any disciplinary action taken other than a verbal reprimand.

Definitions:

- **Competition:** refers to the time between departure to and return from any competition.
- **Team Representative, Delegates:** refers to any individual representing CCO including coaches, athletes, managers, chaperones, officials and Head of Delegation
- **Team Officials:** refers to Head of Delegation, Team Managers, coaches or other persons appointed by CCO to have responsibility for athletes during a competition.
